He was born in Fray Bentos (Uruguay). Gonzalo Solari is considered by critics one of the most refined guitarists of his generation. He studied guitar with Amílcar Rodríguez Inda (Mito Tálvez) and Abel Carlevaro completing his studies of Harmony, Counterpoint, Fugue and Interpretation with Guido Santorsola. Solari developed his career as a concert performer in different countries around the world: from America to Russia, from Japan to Switzerland. He has won prestigious international guitar awards and he is considered a performer with impeccable technique, excellent phrasing and a profound stylistic rigour, all of which place him among the protagonists in the world panorama of guitarists. Gonzalo Solari is also a highly esteemed teacher who is often invited to participate in international festivals as performer, teacher or member of the jury for important contests. Beyond the limits of the traditional virtuoso, he stands out as one of the most cultured experts in the guitar world and he contributes to specialized magazines in America and Europe. Solari played a guitar concert November 15th 2002 during the XI Encuentro Internacional de Guitarra Ciudad de Linares "Andrés Segovia", in Spain. He performed at the Casa Museo (Museum House) entitled to the famous Spanish guitarist in front of a large audience which paid homage to him with a long and warm applause. He was the first American guitarist to play a concert in the Museum after the body of Andrés Segovia was moved to the private crypt at the Museum House.
